INTRODUCING MOUNTAIN SKY CONFERENCE'S NEW BISHOP

Earlier this month, the delegates to the Western Jurisdiction Conference prayed, discussed, and discerned episcopal leadership for our jurisdiction. Two new bishops were elected and consecrated, one of which is the new bishop for the Mountain Sky Conference, replacing Bishop Karen. Bishop Kristin Stoneking has served churches in Kansas and California. In addition, she has been a campus minister at UC Davis, was the Executive Director of the Fellowship for Reconciliation, served as a District Superintendent as well as the Director of Ministry Innovation and Congregational Development in the California-Nevada Annual Conference, and most recently was appointed as the Associate Professor of United Methodist Studies and Leadership at Pacific School of Religion. She holds a PhD from the Graduate Theological Union in Berkeley.

Our new bishop has ties to our conference. She credits her childhood friend, who lives in Colorado, as one of the people she looks forward to spending quality time with and anticipates participating in activities she's watched from afar — our conference's passion for a mission-focused, active community. When asked for one thing she appreciates about the Mountain Sky Conference Bishop Stoneking said, "I see and feel your abundance of love." The bishop will begin her duties officially on September 1, 2024.

What is Plarn? Plarn is made from recycled plastic bags, transforming waste into a valuable resource. These mats provide comfort and insulation for individuals experiencing homelessness, offering them a much-needed place to rest.

Why Plarn Sleeping Mats?

- 1. Sustainability: By recycling plastic bags, we reduce waste and protect our environment.
- 2. Comfort: Plarn mats provide a soft, waterproof surface that helps shield against the elements.
- 3. Community Impact: Every mat made represents our commitment to caring for our neighbors in need.

Fun fact: it takes 600-700 recycled plastic bags to make a 6' x 2 ½' mat with two-inch straps and carry handle. We want to make as many as possible to giveaway during the Free Project August 10!
